


#### **Introducing Vets Helping Vets**



RSVP is excited to introduce Vets Helping Vets, a program which assists veterans, spouses or partners who no longer drive. Drivers who are veterans themselves (or their spouses) are able to provide transpor-

tation to any medical appointment, the grocery store or other necessary appointments for fellow veterans.





Volunteer drivers receive mileage reimbursement, supplemental liability insurance and staff support and training, as well as volunteer recognition throughout the year.

#### From the Desk of the Director.



Mr. Larson talks with his portal buddy everyday now. He also had Sherrill add his son on the portal, now he visits with his son every night. The quilt in this picture is a quilt of valor and was donated to him by a group of sewers and delivered by Sherrill, it was given to him unceremoniously. Recently Sherrill was able to help Mr. Larson with another project. He finally confided to Sherrill he couldn't use the microwave as he is

blind. Sherrill came up with an idea to use felt dots on the buttons of the microwave, with the number of dots to determine a task. Mr. Larson can now use the microwave to warm up foods and make popcorn.

#### Gifts Men Shelter: A NEW Addition to our Community Referral Program



**Kitchen Coordinator** - train new volunteers, organize the kitchen and be available 3 - 5 days a week as needed.

**Receptionist** - be the first point of contact for guests entering the shelter, answering phone calls and more

Thrift Store Volunteer - organizing, sorting, working with donations received at shelter.

**Life Recovery Coach** - Share you knowledge, experience and wisdom as a guide and role model and help shelter guests develop a Life Improvement Plan.

#### **Other Community Referral Program Opportunities**

RSVP Volunteers are referred to a variety of non profit agencies as requests are received. Volunteer assignments include health care facilities, (hospitals, nursing homes, public clinics) senior focused programs such as various positions in a local senior center) transportation programs, serving on local governing boards, tax counseling and delivering home delivered meals. You could also be placed in volunteer positions in local food pantries, museums, homeless shelters domestic violence shelters and schools as well as a variety of other agencies.

### **B.A.B.E.S.** (Beginning Alcohol and Addictions Basic Education Studies)

Be a part of puppet shows at area schools that deliver an educational message to students, enabling them to learn how to handle peer pressure and feelings and how to develop a positive self image. Perfect for those who love to perform, have a sense of whimsey and enjoy the stage. Volunteers perform at each school for a six week period, teaching kids about the dangers of drugs, peer pressure and the importance of making sound decisions.

### Another NEW Volunteer Opportunity!! The Foster Grandparent Program



Share your time and experience teaching job skills to economically disadvantaged youth, tutor and mentor in schools, support children of veterans and deployed military. Help children in your own community develop valuable academic and life skills that are critical to their future success. Join with nearly 30,000 volunteers across the nations helping to improve the life of more than 280,000 young people. This program has clear cut goals, so you can be assured the time you spend is focused and purposeful. This program allows you to make a positive difference in YOUR community.

### Volunteer Opportunities continued.....

#### **America Reads Program Opportunities**

Work one on one and in small groups with children in kindergarten through third grade who are at risk of difficulty in learning to read. This is a nationally recognized program.

#### **Intergenerational Heroes**

Work with students in fourth through sixth grade for six weeks, sharing a hobby or skill the students can continue on their own. There are groups in arts and crafts, knitting, cooking and games. Help students learn they are valued by adults in their community.

#### **SVS Program (Seniors Volunteering for Seniors)**

Do you enjoy meeting others and getting out and around your community? The SVS program provides a variety of opportunities to share your talents. Volunteers provide transportation for seniors to various appointments, as well as respite relief, phone assurance, friendly visits and more. These volunteers meet with each other on a regular basis to provide networking and educational opportunities.

#### **Home Based Programs**

We also have groups of volunteers and those that work individually from their homes doing tasks such as working on mailings, updating records, sewing items for needy families, make stuffed animals for abused or grieving children, as well as crochet mittens, hats and scarves for children and lap robes for adults in nursing homes and assisted living facilities.

#### **Seniors Volunteering for Seniors**

**Transportation Program** – Assist fellow seniors in getting to their doctors appointments, the grocery store, the pharmacy and other essential errands. There is a growing need in rides for seniors and RSVP is continually searching for drivers in the Rock County area. These volunteer drivers also substitute for Food Pantry Drivers, and an additional person to the Beloit route to assist the driver. Drivers are reimbursed at \$.50 per mile and offered supplemental insurance when needed.

**Phone Assurance -** This program helps seniors to remember to take their medicine, provides someone to check on them or offers an individual to visit on the phone. Hours vary beginning at 8:00 a.m.

**Friendly Visitor** - Seniors Volunteering for Seniors is in need of volunteers to fill friendly visit opportunities. A friendly visit can consist of talking, playing cards, games or just being there to spend time with them.

**RSVP** - RSVP is looking for energetic board members to help fulfill the mission of the agency. The board meets once a month on the third Friday, in the morning. Board members are also asked to participate in fundraising activities, including the volunteer recognition dinner in June. If you are interested, please contact **Pam Carper at (608) 362-9593.** 

COVID 19 Pantry Delivery Program - Drivers pick up food orders at area pantries and deliver to clients throughout Rock County. This is a contactless delivery system. Drivers deliver items to front door and then call clients from their car. They wait until client comes to door to receive the delivery before they leave. CARITAS / Beloit - Every Friday at 11:45, ECHO /Janesville - Every Thursday at 11:45, Orfordville CUP / 1st and 2nd Thursday at 9:45, Clinton Lutheran Pantry - 3rd Tuesday at 11:00 a.m. Routes take one to two hours.



**Virtual Social Gathering -** Thanks to a grant from the Community Care Corps we were able to purchase a group of Facebook portals, as well as the internet connection for them. Clients simply tell the portal who they want to reach and it is connected. During the conversation, both individuals are able to see and hear each other. We are in need of several individuals who are interested in connecting with 2 or 3 individuals, as well as someone with computer knowledge who would be willing to set up the portals in individuals homes. Volunteers would make weekly contact with individuals just to visit and check in on them. If you are interested in this
