Retired and Senior Volunteer Program of Rock County, Inc. Mission

RSVP seeks to enrich the lives of volunteers, age 55 and older, through meaningful service opportunities that match their life skills and interests to community needs.

The Retired & Senior Volunteer Program of Rock Co., Inc. is one of 17 Wisconsin Programs sponsored by the Corporation for National Service. Nationally, there are over 760 RSVPs with over 460,000 volunteers. Rock County RSVP was organized in 1973. It was originally sponsored by the Voluntary Action Center. In 1987, RSVP became incorporated in the State of Wisconsin as an independent nonprofit agency.

RSVP volunteers have the opportunity to work in one or more of four areas:

- Community Referrals
- Homebased and Group Projects
- Intergenerational Programs
- Seniors Volunteering for Seniors

Community Referrals Program

RSVP volunteers are referred to non-profit agencies as requests are received. Volunteer assignments include: health care facilities, senior-focused programs(like dining & senior centers), transportation programs, serving on governing boards locally and regionally, tax counseling, home delivered meals, food pantries, chambers of commerce, homeless shelters, domestic violence shelters and schools.

RSVP Home Based and Group Projects

RSVP volunteers work individually and in groups on projects for public and private nonprofit organizations and schools. Volunteers may sew items for needy families in shelters or knit and crochet mittens, hats, neck warmers and sweaters for children in shelters and schools. Lap robes are made for seniors in long term health care facilities. Baby items are made for local hospitals and nutrition sites.

Seniors Volunteering for Seniors

RSVP volunteers provide Transportation Assistance, Handyman Services, Friendly Visitation, Respite Relief and Phone Reassurance to seniors living in Rock County and the stateline area.

RSVP Intergenerational Programs

America Reads

America Reads is a national program to assure that all students are able to read at grade level by the end of 3rd grade. Volunteers spend time each week in a 1:1 or small group setting reading with children.

BABES (Beginning Alcohol and Addictions Basic Education Studies)

Through the use of puppets, our volunteers visit a school once a week for five weeks and work with students on Self-Image, Feelings, Decision-Making, Peer Pressure, Coping Skills, Alcohol and other Drug Information and Getting Help.

Folk Fairs

Folk Fairs are held in schools, where students and seniors are brought together to share and learn from each other. Volunteers demonstrate or display various lost arts, crafts and skills. Children have the opportunity to see quilling, rug braiding, wood carving, wood burning, antiques, toys, embroidery, dolls, spinning wool & buttons and help make and taste butter.

Foster Grandparents

A child is matched with a volunteer who is able to mentor the youth with social, behavioral, academic and life skills. Youth involved include elementary through high school students, teen moms and unaccompanied youth.

Intergenerational Heroes

Volunteers partner with students in 4th through 6th grade in an after-school program. The students are introduced to a hobby or skill that they can then continue on their own. Groups in Arts and Crafts, Cooking, Sewing, Games and Knitting/Crocheting are offered.
