So many youth in our area are making a difference. We will feature a different child each edition.


Calais Chmielewski

Scottish Holiday Recipes

In Scotland, New Years is a very important family holiday. These recipes are from Larisa's Scottish Grandmother, Agnes Stirrat and her Great Aunts who made these for family festivities at the New Year.

<u>Currant Cakes</u> (For Fun these are referred to as Fly Cemeteries but don't let that name scare you. They are yummy.)

2 crust pie dough I large apple, peeled & grated I jar of jam 2 boxes/bags of currants 2 Tbs butter I/4 c. sugar Roll out one crust to fit small cookie sheet. Spread jam, then apple, then currants Crumble butter over filling, sprinkle sugar Top with top of pastry. Crimp edges, slat top. Bake at 375 for 20 minutes or until golden brown. Sprinkle sugar over baked currant cake.

Scottish Shortbread I/2 cup sugar I/2 pound butter 2 I/2 cups flourCream butter and sugar. Add flour slowly, leaving I/2 cup out. Make dough as soft as a baby's bottom. (Grandma's words) Roll out dough to 1/4 in. thick Cut lines diagonally about 3/4 inch wide. Cut lines opposite direction to desired cookie size. Poke dough all around with a fork Bake at 300 for 10 minutes. Then reduce temp to 275 and bake 30-35 minutes. Sprinkle with granulated sugar and then let cool.
